Situation Update
As of March 18, 2020



The number of reported confirmed cases of COVID-19 has increased by 15123 cases since the last situation report published yesterday, bringing the total number of globally reported cases to 191127.

NOTE: Data presented in the COVID-19 World Health Organization Reports has changed to reflect data reported as of 00:00 CET. As this is the first Epidemiological Bulletin with the new reporting period, there is overlap of data between the previous and this bulletin, thus the number of new cases may not equal the difference between total cases in the two reports.

The total reported confirmed cases and the new cases per World Health Organization (WHO) regions are as below:

- Western Pacific Region 91845 confirmed cases (312 new cases) and 3357 deaths (23 new)
- European Region 74760 confirmed cases (10911 new cases) and 3352 deaths (604 new)
- South-East Asia 538 confirmed cases (63 new cases) and 9 deaths (1 new)
- Eastern Mediterranean Region 18060 confirmed cases (1552 new cases) and 1010 deaths (140 new)
- Regions of the Americas 4979 confirmed cases (2243 new cases) and 68 deaths (18 new)
- African Region 233 confirmed cases (42 new cases) and 4 deaths (0 new)

According to The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) in Europe several countries are now experiencing sustained local transmission of novel coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). The risk of severe disease associated with COVID-19 infection for people in the Europe is currently considered moderate for the general population and high for older adults and individuals with chronic underlying conditions, based on the probability of community transmission and the impact of the disease.

One new state Montenegro reported cases of COVID-19 in the past 24 hours.

Most patients with COVID-19 are adults. The most commonly reported symptoms included fever, dry cough, and shortness of breath, and most patients **(80%) experienced mild illness**. Approximately 14% experienced severe disease and 5% were critically ill. Early reports suggest that illness severity is associated with age (>60 years old) and co-morbid disease.

NOTE: *The cases reported by Saipem Health Department are in line with the numbers reported by World Health Organization. For few countries, with the support of our local departments, data was updated according to local Ministries of Health. In the event of a discrepancy between cases reported by us and cases reported by your respective country public health officials, data reported by countries Health Ministries should be considered the most up to date.*

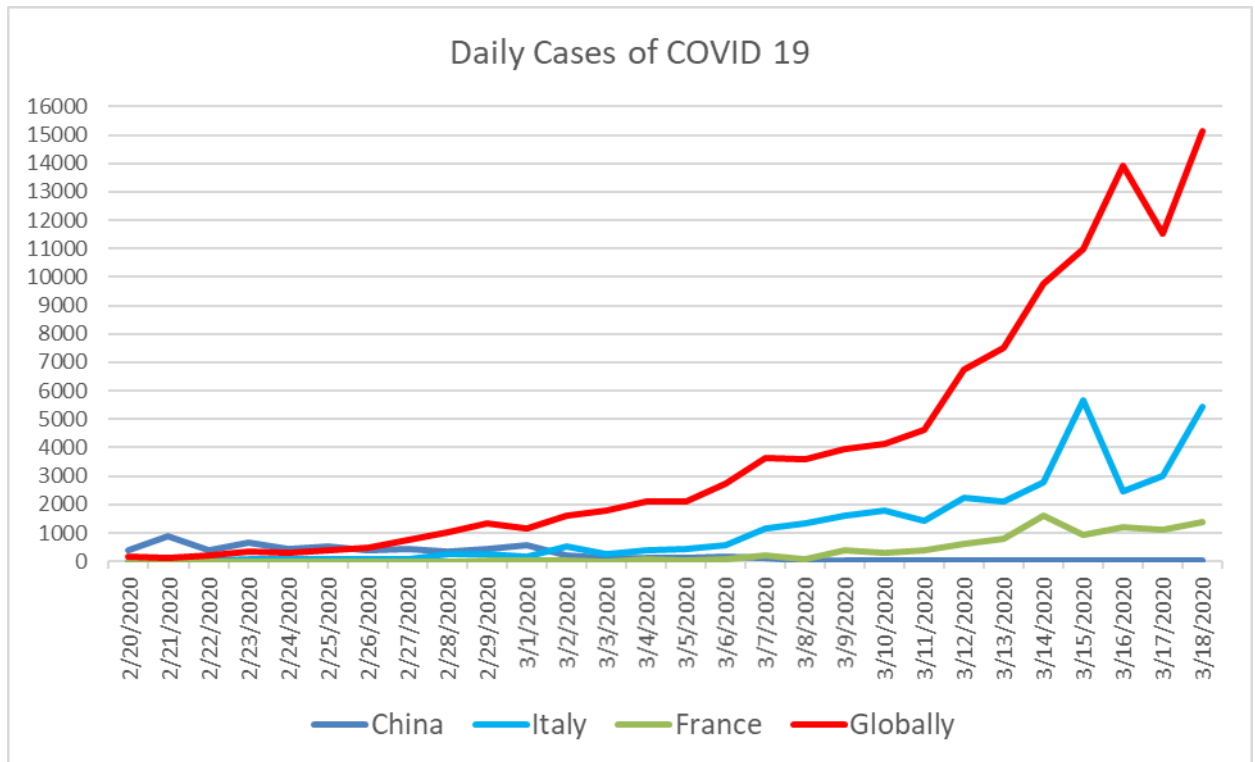

In **Italy** Urgent measures to contain the epidemic are now adopted:

For the purpose of stopping the spread of the COVID-19 virus any movement of persons, incoming and outgoing on all the territory of Italy must be avoided except those motivated by business or health reasons. All schools are closed till 3rd April, gatherings, both outdoors and in enclosed spaces, including all sport events, are prohibited.

According to WHO classification of epidemics, the phase of COVID-19 epidemic is Phase 6: Pandemic phase: increased and sustained transmission in general population

WHO' s assessment of the risk of spread and risk of impact of COVID-19 is "**very high**" at the global level.

The basic principles to reduce the general risk of transmission of COVID-19 infection include the following:

- regularly and thoroughly wash your hands with soap and water or clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand rub
- maintain at least 1 meter (3 feet) distance between yourself and anyone who is coughing or sneezing.
- avoid mass gatherings
- avoiding close contact with people suffering from acute respiratory infections.
- avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth – to avoid transfer of the virus to your eyes, nose or mouth, from where the virus can enter your body
- travelers with symptoms of acute respiratory infection should practice cough etiquette (maintain distance, cover coughs and sneezes with disposable tissues or clothing, and wash hands) and visit medical doctor immediately.
- any person with symptoms of acute respiratory infection, similar to COVID, has to stay at home, cancel eventual travels (also to avoid possible problems at the airports) and seek medical advice from his/her family doctor, if in reasonable vicinity, Saipem medical team or through Pronto Dottore

The measures put in place are:

- Business trips are suspended until further notice
- All travel and transfers must be limited to the bare minimum and in any case subject to an assessment of the impossibility to manage the related task through audio or video conferences.
- The following countries: China, Republic of South Korea, Iran, Italy, Spain and France are considered to be at high virus transmission risk and with an ongoing COVID-19 epidemic. This should be reflected in the specific Risk evaluation matrix
- The affected geographical regions are now: Western Pacific Region; Eastern Mediterranean Region and European Region
- Smart working, when possible, will be proposed for 14 days to all those who, or whose family members/dependents, come back from the above-mentioned countries.
- Those coming back from countries/areas with high virus transmission risk to their home country, upon any complain of fever, cough or breathing difficulties shall stay at home, and seek immediate medical advice
- Local Health Functions shall be in touch with the local national health authorities of each country where Saipem operates in order to be updated with their recommendations regarding COVID-19 and to implement these recommendations.
- The measures undertaken in Italy are placed on Intranet.
